## Ouse Fen (south) RSPB reserve visit – 8<sup>th</sup> September 2019

A small group of members together with the Warden Chris Hudson, visited the Fen on afternoon of the 8<sup>th</sup> September. Some members spotted a Water Vole in the ditch near the entrance to the reserve (TL 381718). Others missed the sighting, too busy photographing *Berula erecta*, Lesser Water Parsnip and *Sagittaria sagittifolia*, Arrowhead, also in the ditch. Weather was warm and clear, and Chris provided an excellent overview of the work of the RSPB and the success in attracting a wide variety of species to the site. Below are lists of those seen during the visit. Butterflies were scarce but Red Admiral and Small Heath occurred.



## Other Species noted from visit 08/09/2019 HFFS 14.30-16.30

Birds included: Buzzard; Cetti's Warbler; Coot; Cormorant; Crane; Gadwall; Goldfinch;

Great Crested Grebe; Heron; Hobby; House Sparrow; Kestrel; Lapwing; Magpie; Mallard; Marsh Harrier; Moorhen; Mute Swan; Reed Bunting; Shoveller.

Most plant species were recorded in former intensive agricultural land (arable / grassland) now intermittently grazed by cattle. The wetlands consist of disused

gravel workings dominated by *Phragmites australis* and associated drainage ditches.

At the end of the walk we spotted a damselfly, which we later identified as an Emerald Damselfly.
